<u>First:</u> Pick a frequency from this list for the 6AR / 6IP Network Command channel. These are linked together so pick **one** that is strong and clear in your area. All Fire and rescue turnouts in the Perth area are on this channel. Channels 1-99 are mid band (78MHz), 101-653 are high band (165MHz)

Next: For major incidents, listen for the channels being allocated. It will be one command channel and a number of sector channels. The command channel is usually a repeater channel between 101 and 400, 1 and 45 or 59 and 73. Most command channels are dual midband/highband repeaters linked together. Incidents managed by DPaW will use channels between 500 and 653. Smaller incidents and miscellaneous comms use simplex channel "Command 1" - 467.7875MHz.

Each *sector* is allocated a simplex channel between **46** and **49**, **96** and **99** or **354** and **365**. These simplex channels are also occasionally used as *command* channels. Comms with private and council resources (bulldozers, etc) on the fireground sector will usually use standard UHF CB.

<u>Air support</u> and their ground controllers use repeater channels **644** or **621** and air tactical simplex channels such as **368** or **369**.
